Five reasons to avoid going to DMV

Get 'em by mail, by phone, online or at any DMV Select, and you can avoid that fee. Plus if you renew online at dmvnow.com, you can save an additional \$1 off on top of all that.

SFX: [ONE MORE DOLLAR BILL BEING COUNTED OUT]

Announcer: Which technically means you'd have *six* reasons to avoid going to DMV. (But who's counting?) So avoid the \$5 in-person service fee—renew your vehicle registration by mail, by phone, at a DMV Select or online at dmvNOW.com.
