
WHY?

- Specific demographic target audience
- One behavioral target theme
- Clear message with a measurable call to action

Develop the Campaign

- Coordination
- Duration
- Co-locate delivery methods
- Multiple media channels
- Personalize messages
- Evergreen



EVERY CORNER IS A CROSSWALK - 2020

Goals

- Reduce the number of crashes between vehicles and people walking
- Increase compliance with Virginia State Law VA Code 46.2-924

Targets

- Behavior: lack of crosswalk compliance from both drives and pedestrians
- Geography: Downtown Roanoke and Northwest quadrant of the City
- Audience: Adult men ages 22 to 64


Message

"In Virginia, Every Corner is a Crosswalk, whether it is painted or not "

- Pedestrians: Cross at the corner
- Drivers: Stop at the corner

Campaign

- Eight weeks July 13 September 4, 2020
- Overall \$100,000 in paid media with an extra donated and earned media of nearly \$70,000
- Over 50 local partners engaged in the campaign
- Community engagement: Yard Signs, Surveys, Community Videos, Art Contest and Victim Videos
- Evergreen materials

Targets

- Behavior: driving above the speed limit along City Streets
- Geography: 10 priority corridors
- Audience: Men 25 and under


Message

- Together we can make our streets a safer place
- It is up to you to keep our streets safe.

Campaign

- Eight weeks June 21– August 15, 2020
- Community Walk Kick Off (50 Participants)
- Community engagement: Pledge, Ambassador Program, Community Videos Art Contest
- Local partners, Influencers, social media
- Media investment of ~ \$100K plus match

- 25% Match (earn media, 1:1 match, donations, staff time)
