# COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION FUND REVENUE REPORT September 2025

# <u>Summary</u>

Commonwealth Transportation Fund (CTF) revenues increased by 12.2 percent (\$67.2 million) in September compared to the same month last year. This increase is primarily attributable to increased Motor Fuels Tax and Insurance Premiums Tax collections.

#### Motor Fuels Tax

Motor fuels taxes collections increased 8.7 percent in September compared to the same month last year.

The West Texas Intermediate Spot Crude Oil Price average decreased to \$63.96 per barrel in September from \$64.86 in August. The Energy Information Administration's (EIA) forecast for crude oil prices suggests that the price, as measured by the Brent Crude Oil Index, will decrease in 2026 to \$51 per barrel from an average of \$65 per barrel in 2025, a decrease of 22 percent. This reduction will be caused by a planned increase in oil production from the U.S. and OPEC+ countries.

Real average price of a gallon of regular fuel increased slightly to \$3.18 in September. The EIA estimates that the increased supply of crude oil will drive the average price of a gallon of gas to approximately \$2.90 next year, down from an expected \$3.10 average price for 2025.

### Motor Vehicle Sales and Use Tax

Motor vehicle sales tax collections increased by 2.4 percent in September.

Total U.S. light vehicle sales increased to 16.4 million units in September 2025.

New light-vehicle sales increased 6.7 percent in September year-over-year, with one more selling day this month compared to last year. The average transaction price for a new vehicle increased to over \$50,000 for the first time. This was 2.1 percent higher than August's average price and 3.6 percent higher than in September 2024. Used car sales decreased in September to 1.42 million units sold, a decrease of 5.2 percent month over month, which still denotes growth of 6.6 percent compared to last September. According to the Manheim Used Vehicle Value Index, prices were down 0.2 percent month-overmonth in September, which still denotes 2.0 percent growth compared to this month last year.

According to Cox Automotive, 147,716 new electric vehicles were sold during September, which denotes a decrease of 0.6 percent from August, which is still a 44.4 percent year-over-year increase from this month last year. Used EV sales totaled 40,569 for the month, a 4.8 percent increase over August, and a substantial year-over-year increase of 75.6 percent over September of last year. The average transaction price for a new electric vehicle increased 1.7 percent this month compared to August, but decreased 0.4 percent compared to September 2024. The average transaction price of a used electric vehicle decreased 0.3 percent month-over-month, which also denotes a decrease of 6.5 percent year-over-year. With federal credits for EVs now expired the market will be driven by how companies address vehicle costs and consumer expectations.

## State Retail Sales Tax

The transportation portion of state retail sales tax collections increased by 9.1 percent in September.

#### Motor Vehicle Licenses

Motor vehicle registration fee collections increased 25.6 percent in September.
