You will need to provide proof of US Citizenship or Legal Presence for these transactions:

- All ID Cards
- First-time Driver's Licenses
- Expired Licenses
- Suspended, Revoked or Cancelled Licenses

This law was passed by the 2003 General Assembly. It goes into effect January 1, 2004.

If you are applying for a photo ID card, a first-time learner's permit or first-time driver's license, you must show

- Two proofs of identity
- Proof of Virginia residency
- Proof of social security number if you have one *
- Proof of legal presence

* Not required if you are applying for a photo ID card.

Legal presence can be proved using an official U.S. birth certificate or a valid or expired U.S. passport. It can also be proved using a variety of other documents, such as a Certificate of Citizenship, Resident Alien Card or a valid foreign passport with a visa, I-94 or I-94W from a participating country.

If you already hold a valid driver's license, you will not be required to prove legal presence when you renew it. However, if your driver's license expires or is suspended, revoked or cancelled, you must prove legal presence when you reinstate your driving privilege.
